Cycle 1: Bachelor's Degree

- Duration: 3-4 years
- Credits: 180-240 ECTS
- Entry: High school diploma
- Focus: Foundational knowledge

Cycle 2: Master's Degree

- Duration: 1-2 years
- Credits: 60-120 ECTS
- Entry: Bachelor's degree

The **European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS)** standardizes academic credits across Europe.

Credit Calculation:

- **1 ECTS = 25-30 hours** of student work
- Includes: lectures, seminars, projects, self-study, exams

Degree Requirements:

- **Bachelor's:** 180 ECTS (3 years) or 240 ECTS (4 years)
- **Master's:** 60 ECTS (1 year), 90 ECTS (1.5 years), or 120 ECTS (2 years)
- **PhD:** No fixed ECTS; based on research completion
